Background

Background

PD-1, or programmed cell death protein 1, is a cell surface receptor protein primarily expressed on activated T cells. It plays a pivotal role in regulating immune responses by interacting with its ligands, PD-L1 and PD-L2, which are often expressed on cancer cells and antigen-presenting cells. Binding of PD-1 to its ligands leads to inhibition of T cell activation and proliferation, suppressing immune responses against cancer cells and contributing to immune evasion. Blocking the PD-1/PD-L1 interaction with therapeutic antibodies enhances T cell activity, making PD-1 inhibitors a promising approach in cancer immunotherapy.

Reconstitution

It is recommended to reconstitute the lyophilized protein in sterile H₂O to a concentration of 200 µg/mL and incubate the stock solution for at least 20 min to ensure sufficient re-dissolved.

Stability & Storage

This product is stable after storage at:

- -20°C for 12 months in lyophilized state from date of receipt.
- -20°C or -80°C for 1 month under sterile conditions after reconstitution.

Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.

Shipping

The product is shipped with polar packs. Upon receipt, store it immediately at -20°C or lower for long term storage.

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
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SDS-PAGE analysis of recombinant mouse PD-1 protein.

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
